Our mission is to create a space for LGBTIQ+ advocates and organisations to work together, build bridges, and speak with a common voice.

In order to facilitate a conversation about LGBTIQ+ rights in Australia we need to have a platform to share our ideas and experiences and ask the hard questions about how we can move forward and tackle what's important. The conference aims to explore current issues facing the LGBTIQ+ movement with the primary purpose of creating a truly intersectional discussion about achieving meaningful social change to create a fairer, more equal and more just Australia. Over the last two years, over 2,500 people from across the LGBTIQ+ sector and allies have attended our national conferences and regional symposiums. Easy Language Information

The Equality Project is an Australian group that works with LGBTIQA+ people and our supporters. The Equality Project wants to make sure LGBTIQA+ people work together well so we can make things better for our community.

The Equality Project runs a national conference each year. It is called **Better Together**. The conference brings lots of different people together to talk about things that are important to LGBTIQA+ people. There are people from health organisations, community groups, and other people.

In 2021, **Better Together** will happen in Adelaide. The dates are Friday 18 to Saturday 19 June.

There will be some extra meetings on the day before the conference. This is Thursday 17 June. At **Better Together**, a special meeting is called a **caucus**.

There will be a caucus for LGBTIQA+ people with a disability. If you are an LGBTIQA+ person with a disability, you are welcome to come to this caucus.

At the caucus, we will talk about:

- The good things and the problems that LGBTIQA+ people with disability live with
- How we can work together to solve the problems
- How we can support each other
- How we can support other LGBTIQA+ groups

Where and when is it being held?

- From **9am to 12:30pm**

How can you get a ticket?
